March 15 arrives and Caesar, ignoring the pleas of his wife and sure of his own power, goes to the Roman Senate. As they plead mercy for one of their associates, and as Caesar declares himself immovable and superior, the conspirators draw their daggers and slaughter Caesar, who dies at the feet of the statue of Pompey, his predecessor. As the citizens of Rome flee in confusion, the conspirators bathe their arms in Caesar's blood and proclaim themselves liberators of the state of Rome. Mark Antony, friend of Caesar, begs an audience with Brutus. Cassius and Brutus explain their justifications for killing Caesar and Antony declares himself satisfied, begging only that they allow him to give Caesar's funeral oration. Brutus gives him permission over Cassius' objections.
